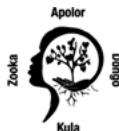

Isaac was born and raised in Namulesa, a word-of-mouth borough in Jinja City, Uganda where, witnessing older people organize around development causes for community as well as individual economic growth, he was unconsciously introduced to the bottom-up approach to development; learning first-hand that if people are mobilized, a local heuristic system devoid of politics can be a trigger to Household economic development in communities.

It was in those formative years, where, as a primary school kid juggling between being a part time chef and waiter in a makeshift mud and wattle restaurant on weekends, and a samosa and pancakes hawker before and after classes that Isaac was introduced to what would later be important qualities in the world of entrepreneurship, business and innovation: Time Management, the ability to multi-task, the honour of being trusted, humbleness when you have and hope when you don't.

A recipient of the Alfred Friendly Press Fellowship, Isaac graduated with a Bachelor of Arts Honours Degree in Mass Communications from Makerere University in 2010 and thereafter embarked on a seven year eventful stint as a journalist with Monitor Publications where he rose from being Makerere University correspondent to Heading the Parliament and Oil and Gas beats before resigning and going into entrepreneurship and business; starting, together with investor friends, Mojabet, a gaming

and betting company behind Lucky 3 and Cash 5, both games of chance products and Outcome Communications, a start-up strategic public affairs communications firm.

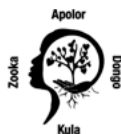
